#### **ACADEMIC SUPPORTS**

As Law College Officer, I would want to work on reviewing the Academic Advisor programme, and expanding the law library with more recent editions. I would continue to secure lecture recordings to decrease barriers to education and support commuters. I would meet with module coordinators to discuss issues like inconsistencies with exam grading, module suggestions like US Law and UK Law, and implementing tutorials for third and fourth-years. Outside of modules, I want to support an FE-1 study group which students can join in preparation for the FE-1 exams. I also want to distribute a booklet designed for first-year law students which outlines the supports and advice that will help them in their studies.

#### **SOCIAL SUPPORTS**

As Law College Officer, I would work on highlighting existing mental health supports, financial supports and the Dignity & Respect service. I would organise more social events, such as nights out, quiet spaces, breakfasts for early commuters, study groups, non-alcoholic events, guest speakers, society collaborations and roadshows.

## **DIVERSITY**

As Law College Officer, I would work on advocating for the Universal Design mechanism to be implemented within the teaching approaches in the law school to support students of all needs. I would also continue lobbying for automatic assignment extensions for students with disabilities and financial supports for lowincome students and those facing other barriers.

#### **FACILITIES**

As Law College Officer, I would focus on improving the facilities in the law school. This would include consulting on the redesign of the law school to include more study spaces and social spaces on the upper levels, with booths rather than small desks. I would pressure UCD Estates to improve the visibility of the pedestrian crossings outside the law school and add more benches outside. I want to make plugs and hot water amenities more widely available, as well as extending the café opening hours or running coffee afternoons for those with later classes. I would also work on making tutorial rooms bookable for project work or group study.

#### **DEVELOPMENT & CAREERS**

As Law College Officer, I would organise careers events and panel discussions, especially for Access and mature students. These will include events for pursuing careers as solicitors, barristers or non-law careers such as politics, journalism or entrepreneurship. I would also advocate for information sessions focusing on qualifying in the UK and other jurisdictions more well-known, in addition to different opportunities available like the London Trip. As well as making the information on Erasmus and the internship programme more well-known, I would also help develop a resource to highlight the experiences of previous students and organise a post-offer information session/mixer to clarify issues, e.g. accommodation and language requirements.

## COMMUNICATION

As Law College Officer, I would focus on communicating through group chats and a social media account with regular updates on my manifesto promises, upcoming events, and the work of UCDSU. I would also work more with the Class Reps to organise events and nights out.
